This edition: Caroline Chisholm Society

Tell us about Caroline Chisholm Society.

Focussing on alleviating pressures for pregnant women and families with preschool children, Caroline Chisholm Society (CCS) offers free emotional assistance through pregnancy and counselling support either by phone or in person. The Society also provides material aid in the form of new and quality pre-loved baby clothes, toys, books, nursery equipment and food. CCS also offer family support which includes assessment, planning and action within the Child FIRST framework, case management and in-home support to families, housing support including advocacy and assistance with priority housing applications, social support including mentoring and through devised programmes addressing such things as parenting strategies, challenging behaviours and post natal depression.

Caroline Chisholm Society is the recipient of a 2014-16 Moonee Valley Partnership Grant. Can you tell us about the program this grant enables?

This grant enables Caroline Chisholm Society's 'Women for Women' programme which is all about women working with women to help women. We encourage women to get involved and volunteer to help sort the new and pre-loved donations, cleaning prams, preparing bassinettes, baby bundles and cot packs or knitting. Further to this, caseworkers are invited to contact CCS, outlining clients' needs and a prearranged bundle of goods is prepared for collection, preferably on a Friday. Already, several agencies have accessed the new CCS service. We have captured wonderful feedback, with both caseworkers and families really appreciating the support.

How can people get involved in this project?

Do you know of someone who is a good organiser of clothes and would derive satisfaction and enjoyment from assisting our clients while becoming more engaged within the community? If you are a caseworker, do you have clients who are expectant mothers or with young children? Would you like to access material aid for your clients with such things as pre-school clothing, new born baby bundles, strollers, high chairs, nappies, formula, toys and books?
